# Employability Survey-2018 Career Guidance Unit, Faculty of Management & Finance, University of Colombo

#### • Main objective

o To identify the level of employability of 2013/2017 BBA Graduands of Faculty of Management & Finance, University of Colombo.

#### • Sample

o The survey contains the employment details of 375 graduands attached to eight departments (see Table 1).

### • Geographical representation of graduands

• Table 2 shows the top 10 districts based on the geographical representation of graduands where it depicts that approximately 49% of the graduands are from Colombo and Gampaha Districts.

## • Internship training and other activities
