# Graduate Employability Survey **2021**

University of Colombo

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## Introduction

Graduate Employability survey 2021 was conducted during the General Convocation held in year 2022 for the graduands who completed their final examinations in year 2020. Employability information of graduands are considered in this survey before the convocation is held.

Data for the survey report were collected through a structured questionnaire which was sent by the University Grants Commission and it has been modified slightly by adding few more questions.

It was made mandatory for the graduands to fill the questionnaire to collect the Cloak before the convocation and the survey was conducted In online mode.

Questionnaires filled by the graduates from the following Faculties & Institutes were analyzed and the response rate of the survey is also given in the Table 01 below.

## Methodology

Methodology of the Graduate Employment Survey 2021 was done similarly to the methodology adopted in previous years; i.e. data were collected using a structured questionnaire filled by the responding

graduates. The questionnaire sent by the University Grants Commission which was used in previous rounds of the survey was used in 2021 as well with few new additions to it. The questionnaire is attached to this report as Appendix.

The questionnaire was sent to the students of the faculties, Campus & Institutes along with the convocation letters while instructing them to complete the online survey to collect the cloak from the University.

It was made mandatory for all the graduands to fill the questionnaire to collect the cloak before the convocation.



# Section 01: Background Characteristics of Graduates of University of Colombo

This section covers background factors; Social Background, English Background and Other Background characteristics of graduates.

According to Table 2, most of the graduates of University of Colombo are female graduands (68%).

According to Table 3, 65% of the graduands have received a Distinction for English language in Ordinary Level examination while only 31% of the graduands have received Distinction for English language in Advanced Level examination. Majority of the graduands have performed well in English language in Ordinary Level examination.



According to Table 4, we can identify that 94% of the graduates have undergone an internship and 55% have undergone vocational trainings. Also a majority of the graduands have done Extra Curricular activities (64%) while 52% of the graduates have obtained Professional Qualifications.

Work Experience in the questionnaire refers to full or part time employment while studying in the university. Table 4 also shows that 41% of the graduands have done full/ part time jobs while studying in the university.

Graph 02: Overall Distribution of Academic Merits by the Graduates


Table 5 shows the percentage of graduates who have obtained First Class (13%), Second Upper (28%), Second Lower (33%) and General Passes (25%) in the degree programme. Majority of the graduates have obtained Second Upper/ Lower passes (61%) while a minority have obtained First Classes (13%).

# Section 02: Labor Market Prospects of Graduates of University of Colombo

This section summarizes the responses of graduates on their current labor market status which categorizes respondents into few groups as Permanent Employment, Temporary/Contract Employment, Self-employed, Under-employed, Unemployed, continuing higher studies, Not looking for a job. These are the opinions of the responding graduates.

Note: For the Faculty of Law, graduates need one more year (on average) to complete Attorney at Law qualification. Medical Graduates must wait approximately 9 months after graduation to start the internship.

\*Note: Out of the total respondents, only the graduands who have responded related to employability have been considered in Table 6.


Table 6 confirms that 74% of the graduates who are already employed are females while 85% of the employed graduates are males and the Overall employability is 78% at the time of convocation.


Graph 04: Occupied Sector of the Graduates


Graph 05: Key Attributes to Obtain the Present Job

When considering about the key attributes that affect the graduands to obtain the current job according to their opinion, Majority of the graduands think that degree (75%) and the Field of Study (48%) are the two main attributes that affect the employment in terms of University Education.

English Proficiency (32%) and the Computer Literacy (12%) are the other two main attributes considered by the graduands when considering the attributes which influence the employability.

Graph 06: Job Satisfaction of the Graduates


Considering the Job Satisfaction of the graduates, Majority of the graduates are satisfied or somewhat satisfied with their current job (83%) and only 17% of the graduates are either not satisfied or neutral on the satisfaction.

According to Table 14, among graduates who are already employed, 17% of the graduates have obtained a First Class, 27% of the graduates have obtained a Second Upper, 21% of the graduates have obtained a Second Lower and 35% of the graduates have obtained a General Pass.

Also 74% of the employed graduates have done an internship during their degree programme and 62% of the employed graduates have obtained Professional qualifications.
