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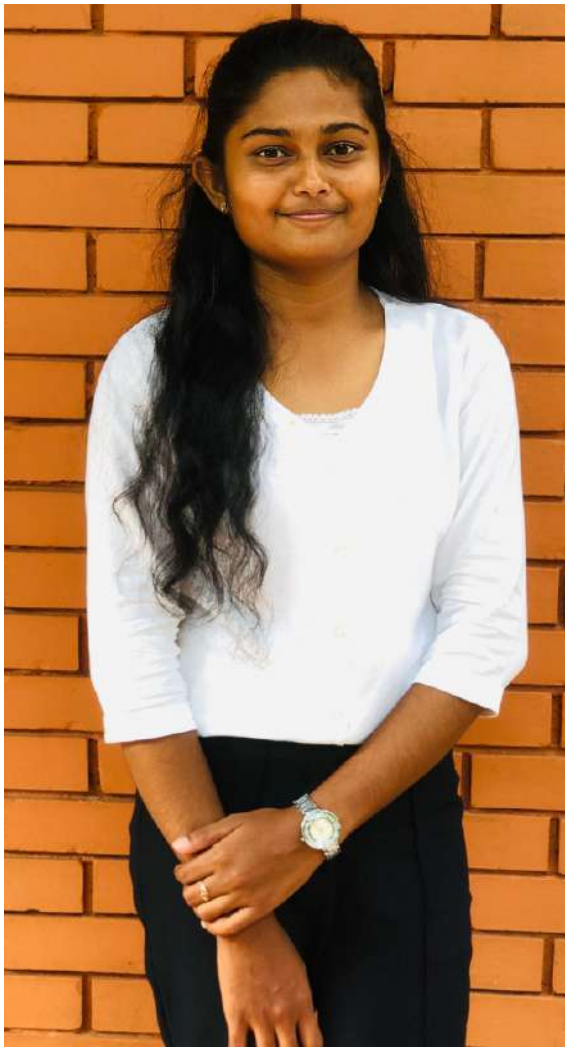
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1. EDITOR'S NOTE AND EDITORIAL PANEL

Can you tell us as a little bit about yourself?

I was born in 1945 in Galle. I was selected to the university of Peradeniya and I graduated with a B.sc(Hons). Then I completed my PhD in the university of Sri Jayawardenapura. Immediately after my graduation I joined DSI in 1967.

Let us know the beginning of your career and the experience throughout your current position?

I started my career in DSI in 1967 immediately after my graduation and worked closely with my father until he passed away in 1984. I am a firm supporter of Ganna Ape De campaign and presently I am the chairman of DSI samson group and group managing director of DSI samson group in 2020.

What are the challenges you faced up to your current position?

I converted the challenges into opportunities. To meet the competition, we started the footwear factory connected with rubber factory. For our industries a lot of imported raw materials are used. Due the restrictions we had lot of issues on importing these raw materials.

According to you, how did the Covid-19 pandemic affect organizations?

Somebody says its positive as there are few companies benefited by Covid - 19 such as gloves and masks industries. But all other companies specially manufacturing companies did not benefit by Covid - 19 not because of the lack of market but infrastructure and logistic issues.

How did Covid-19 affect your organization?

Nobody came to retail outlets because of Covid - 19. But fortunately export orders were there. There was no reduction in export orders. But demand for products manufactured for locals came down. Demand for rubber slippers and jogging shoes went up. But are few items that were in demand such as fashion shoes, wedding shoes, office wear shoes.

How did you overcome challenges you faced during this turbulent time period?

As the factories and retail outlets were closed due to Covid, we had a serious issue of paying salaries to our workers. So we had series of discussions with workers to discuss about the situation that we do not have income to pay salaries. Therefore, immediately we went for a salary cut in the first few months. We explained to our workers the situation and asked them to start growing food in their home. But after few months we managed to pay salaries. But we had several savings also as the electricity and water bill came down and we stopped the supply of meals to our employees. After about 18 months all things were good.

How did the current economic situation in the county affect your industry?

Dollar crisis specially affect our business. Our main market is school shoes. Closing school was a huge loss to us. To import raw materials there were no Dollars. However, we managed to get Dollars from banks. Because of the relationship we have, we were able to manage local constitutes. As the Dollar went up price of the raw materials went up, and because of that price of the end product doubled.

Another issue we faced was the fuel crisis. Because of that, distribution problems were there. The fuel allowance was not enough. So, group transportation arrangements were arranged. Other than that power cut also affected us. As the heavy machines cannot operated materials during that period is wasted.

Our degree programme has been created to give students the knowledge, expertise and training they need in a variety of management and organizational topics. It aims to enable students to analyze current issues in management and organizational activities while giving an adequate theoretical understanding of the field of management and organization studies. And also we are still in the progress of obtaining exemptions from CA Sri Lanka, CIMA, CMA, ACA.

BUSINESS IDEA COMPETITION (BIC) 2022

Objectives of BIC

The competition's major goal is to promote idea generation and make it easier for faculty students to commercialize their business concepts. It is also anticipated to strengthen the connection between the industry and the students.

Competition Structure

Undergraduates of the Faculty of Management and Finance, University of Colombo are eligible to participate in this competition. Participants compete either individually or in teams and submit various ideas in English, Sinhala, or Tamil. The 15 top ideas are chosen after the received concepts have been carefully examined by a panel of internal and external reviewers.

The participants present their concepts during the knock-out rounds, and then a panel of faculty academics and business professionals evaluates the viva voce that follows. The top six concepts chosen after the initial evaluation are then further refined by taking into account the remarks of the evaluators. The top three business ideas are chosen, the winners are announced, and prizes are given out at the conclusion of the event. Those improved top six concepts are then presented in the Grand Finale in front of a panel made up of academics and industry experts.

8. EVENTS

8.1. FOREIGN WORK OPPORTUNITIES AVAILABLE FOR SRI LANKAN UNDERGRADUATES



Ms. Sanduni Uduwana, conducted a Guest Session on "Foreign Work Opportunities Available for Sri Lankan Graduates" for the Students in the Department of Management and Organization Studies on September 23, 2022. The International English Language Testing System (IELTS) is designed to help you work, study or immigrate to a country where English is the native language. This includes countries like Australia, Canada, New Zealand, United Kingdom and USA.

She mentioned that IELTS is an English language test for study, immigration or work, and over three million people take it every year. IELTS is accepted by more than 11,000 employers, universities, schools and immigration agencies worldwide. It tests how much you understand English by speaking, listening, reading and writing. So, we are considered good users of the English language if we score seven points or more.

IELTS is accepted by governments all over the world as a requirement for permanent residency than any other English language test. UK, Australia, Canada, and New Zealand governments accept IELTS results, and the IELTS score needed depends on our visa requirements. After our IELTS test, we can have access to a wide range of career opportunities in English-speaking countries. Various professional bodies require an IELTS score to register in business as well.



8.2. HOW I SEE SRI LANKA AS A CHINESE

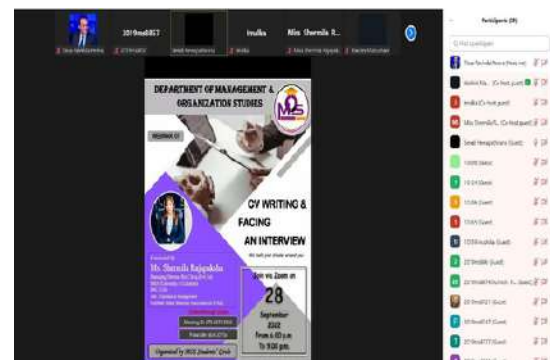
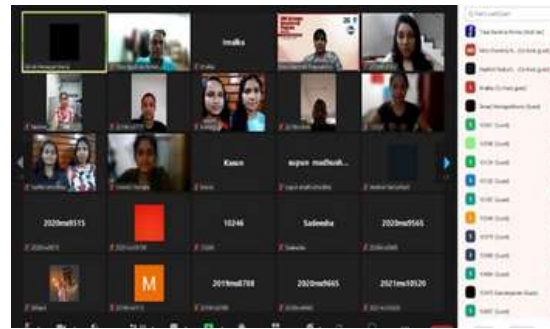


The second event arranged by MOS student cycle under subject cross-cultural management is the Guest Lecture by Mr. Wang Li, who is the Chief Representative in Sri Lanka for TBEA Co. Ltd, China. He conducted the lecture on 29 September 2022. The event was held to make us familiar with different cultures.

Under the topic of "Sri Lanka Culture from view of Chinese", Mr. Wang Li talked about Sri Lanka and China political history and Trade history, how Chinese people are grateful toward Sri Lanka for rubber - rice agreement, Ceylon tea.

He shared his experience about Matara - Kataragama railway project and challenges they faced through the project like religious and cultural beliefs. He also talked about similarities and differences between two cultures and how it is helpful to maintain a long - term relationship.

8.3. CV WRITING AND FACING AN INTERVIEW



‘CV writing and Facing an Interview’, the third event organized by the MOS Students’ Circle, was conducted by Ms. Shermila Rajapaksha, Managing Director, Biz Cliniq (Pvt.) Limited. The event was held on 28th September 2022 to equip undergraduates who will soon be entering the industry with CV writing skills and tips on facing an interview confidently.

Ms. Shermila explained that a CV should have a nice layout, a readable typing space, and standard fonts, limiting the CV to 1-2 pages. One should also be consistent with headings, bullet points and highlights while avoiding spelling and grammar mistakes.

Different types of interviews, including attitude interviews, written tests, walk-in interviews and telephone interviews, were discussed during the session. Further, she pointed out that an interviewee should know about the vision, mission, values, culture, and philosophy of the company and the specific job before facing the interview. Therefore, that is one of the best events we have attended so far.

8.4. INDUSTRIAL DAY OUTING



We had the opportunity to visit Trelleborg Lanka (Pvt) Ltd, Peliyagoda, on 05th October 2022. It is a well-known global supplier of tires and complete wheels for agricultural and forestry machines, fork-lift trucks and other material-handling equipment. Usually, we get to see the manufacturing process of a factory only from video clips.

So, it was a great experience for us to be able to see the entire manufacturing process while studying the behavior of the workers in a highly mechanical working environment.

After touring the factory, we had a special session on 'Management, leadership, and work' at the factory premises. The session was conducted by Mr. Ruchira Walpita, Country Manager – Sri Lanka, Hira Industries LLC and Ms. Shayara Evanjalee, Director Legal and Operations, Chamathka Jewellers. While sharing their personal experiences, they explained about work-life balance and ways of converting our passions into a side hustle. The day was well spent, and we got a valuable experience.



8.5. IT INFRASTRUCTURE FACILITIES FOR E BUSINESS

IT infrastructure facilities for the E-business seminar is the guest lecture arranged by the E-business course on 17th October 2022, which was conducted by Mr. Pabodha Upasena. He is the CEO, of IM solutions (PVT) Ltd was established in the year 2005 and entered the ICT sector in Sri Lanka providing quality Business Software Applications / Solutions and services.

He shared his experience with the concepts related to E-Business. Such as E-commerce business models, Internet marketing strategies, online payment methods, online payment services, common legal issues faced by-commerce businesses, and the basic technologies for e-commerce website development. In addition to the knowledge gained in the lecture, the lecture was very important to gain and develop practical knowledge.
