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
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Introduction to Department of Management & Organization Studies

Let's have a look on the conversation we had with this vibrant personality

Can you tell us a little bit about yourself?

I am Ariyaseela Wickramanayake .I was born in 1949 and I went to St.Aloysius college - Galle. I was selected to the faculty of medicine university of Peradeniya and I did my MBA in HRM. During my school days, I was the fastest swimmer in Sri Lanka.





Let us know the beginning of your career and your current position?

Galle port was being built when I was a child. When Galle port was being built, I saw british divers working there. I saw that they get a huge salary and live a luxury life. So as a young guy I wanted to become a diver. After A/Levels, I got the opportunity to enter the Medical College of University of Peradeniya. At the same time, I got the appointment as a diver in Colombo harbour. When I was confused regarding selecting a one profession, I asked from my teacher and the priest of the church about the accurate selection that I should do. Even though Priest told me to choose the university studies I didn't want to go to university but wanted to do the job I got. Then I asked my father what to do. Then he said that if I'm really interested on the job and then do as my wish. That's how I came out of medical college and became a diver. Currently I'm the Chairman of Pelawatte Diary Industries Ltd and Founder of Master Divers (Pvt) Ltd.

What drives you to become successful in this field as an entrepreneur?

We grew sugar cane and made sugar. We go underwater and make dollars. We get milk and take nutrition for country. You have to do something to make a change in the country. That's my target. If I have to pay seven hundred rupees to buy a loaf of bread, I will buy it. But if I can get another subsidiary loaf of bread for one hundred and eighty rupees, I won't buy it. Because I think it is unfair to paddy farmers to get a loaf of bread for such a little money. I am the one who proposed to build a port in Hambantota. It is 100% my concept. Before proposing it, I went to Hambantota to talk to the people there. Then I saw a 25000 hectare agriculture land and in 2002 I bought it to cultivate sugar cane. Highest ever sugar cane production has produced by Pelawatte. I did it really well and then the government took it over. Now it is in the process of giving it back after twelve years. Later, the Buddhist monks gave me four hundred cows that were roaming freely here and there. I took them to the vets and treated them for about a month and then gave them to the farmers. That's how I got into the milk industry. Currently, I am the largest milk producer in Sri Lanka. We have saved the country 400 billion dollars. I have three powder plants and we produce tons of butter daily. We do not do anything harmful. We could have taken the sugar spirit and made alcohol, but we never did.

How has the economic crisis in the country affected your business?

There is no problem in this country. Have you ever heard that a man died at thirsty? If we take Australia, Australia has the world's largest desert. Who wants to go to such a country? In some countries, it is possible to work only half of the year. There is no way to work for the rest of the year due to weather problems. Are there any such problems in our country? No, we can work well at any time. This is really like heaven. All the resources are in this country. The entire country is



very clean. So who wants to run away from this country to another country. If you want to leave what you have then that's your problem. Our country has plenty of resources. We should use those resources properly. Then there will be no crisis. I give five thousand million to dairy farmers every month. That's a lot of money. They get that money because they have used the available resources in the right way. All you want is to work in the industry that way. Always you must grow something. Work in such a way that you can do your own thing by using the resources in the country. Then no crisis will affect.

How did the corona pandemic affect your business and how did you overcome it?

That is what you call an entrepreneur. Design yourself for the situation. During corona, I ran my business for 365 days without any problems. We did not stop any work. When different problems arise, different tactics should be used to overcome them. You have to be an opportunity to the right thing. Not the opportunity to do anything wrong. You have to do the right thing at the right time in right way.

As an entrepreneur, what qualities do you think an undergraduate has to be an entrepreneur?

Do what you believe that you are good at even if you are sticking. Even if you do something else then develop it. Do whatever you see your growth. You must have a sketch in your mind that this is the man that I am going to be. You must be sure what you want and go on that direction. Always be a target oriented one.





Throwback to the Experiences of MOS Past Student with a 1st Class Honours Degree

Can you give us a brief introduction about yourself?

I had my primary and secondary education at Prince of Wales' College, Moratuwa. In 2010, I entered the Faculty of Management and Finance in the University of Colombo for my bachelor's degree in business administration. In 2014, I graduated with a first-class honors degree and then worked as a human resource professional at two private sector organizations in the country for a couple of years before joining the academia. In September 2016, I joined the Department of Management and Organization Studies (MOS) as a probationary lecturer. In 2019, I completed my master's degree in business administration. That is also from the University of Colombo. Currently I am serving as a Senior Lecturer (Transitional) in the same department that I joined and on study leave since October 2021 to pursue my Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) at Deakin Business School in Melbourne, Australia.

Could you briefly describe how you chose your career path?

In terms of career path, I had three career preferences as an undergraduate. My first preference of course was to become an academic. Secondly, to join the Central Bank of Sri Lanka and last but not the least to be a human resource professional.

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When I had to undertake industrial training as a part of my bachelor's degree, I was able to pursue the latter preference by joining one of the leading finance companies in the country as a Trainee Human Resources Executive. Then I was in the human resource field for two years. In the latter part of my career in human resources, I was called upon to an interview for an academic position in the Department of MOS. At the same time, I had the opportunity to join the Central Bank as a management trainee. I passed the examination and was waiting for the interviews during the same time.

Since I got selected to the academic staff of the department, I did not pursue the option of joining the Central Bank. Because, becoming an academic is what I am still passionate about. The motivation to pursue a career in academia came from the department itself. When I joined the department in 2013 as an undergraduate for my specialization in business administration, I had the opportunity to meet the fabulous academics in the department. Also, teaching is an area which I enjoy the most and an area that I feel more comfortable and interesting. So, when I look back at my short tenure so far, I feel that I have made a gradual progression as an academic, but there is still a long way to go. Normally a career is like a river that changes its direction over its course. But given that I am so passionate about this career, I may be on this same path for the foreseeable future.

Why did you select the department of MOS instead of other departments?

There are two reasons. First, I wanted to gain an educational qualification in a general management discipline. As I said earlier, I had a preference to become a human resource professional. So, I was following a professional qualification in human resource management at a leading educational institution in the country. I thought rather than specializing in the same stream in my bachelor's degree, I would be better off one day if I specialized in business administration which is offered by the department of MOS. The other reason was the opportunity to select the course units based on our preference. At that time the curriculum was different and unlike most conventional degrees, the department was allowing the students to select certain course units based on the preference of the students. I found it interesting and though it would complement my first reason as well. So, I chose the department of MOS for specialization though I had the opportunity to be enrolled in all the other departments. Down the line, I believe that this decision is a turning point in my life, and it has paid off very well so far.





How did the knowledge that you have gained in the department of MOS as a student and as a lecturer contribute to your PhD?

Actually, I had no intention of doing research in my bachelor's degree. It was only articulated when I joined the department. There I was able to catch hold of what is a research? Why are we doing in research? How a research could contribute to the society? etc. So, the credit should go to the lecturers who did research methods at that time. I always found it very interesting.

From there onward, I generated a passion towards research and eventually ended up pursuing a PhD which includes full-time research over a period of three to four years. Sometimes, when I reflect upon myself, I realize that I might not even do a PhD or even take up a career in academics if I ended up in a different department as a student. Then, my research interest towards entrepreneurship was also harnessed by the department itself. I would like to mention the guidance that I received from department staff in this regard, Because it opened a different and interesting avenue in my academic career. So, the department played a substantial role in unleashing my potential as a researcher during my time in the department as a student and as a staff member. The research related knowledge and the experience that I gained from the department is still useful in my PhD. I would like to take this opportunity to thank the department for having the right environment to nurture quality research and enthusiastic academics.

Can you give some insights to newly joined students in the department based on your experience as a former student in the department?


When I was a student, I engaged in a lot of co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. During that time, we had an out bound training program for personality development that was organized by the department. Then, my batch mates in the department got together and did an event – an etiquette workshop for the fellow students in the faculty. Also, the team that I was in had a successful outcome in the enterprise-based project (EBP) in which our business emerged as the overall best business in that year. In addition to that, I played basketball in the university and was the captain in 2014.

So, it was not only academic, but also a blend of co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. This blend of activities unleashed my potential as a student and in return it contributed to the department as well, as at that time the image of the department was not pleasant or positive among faculty's community. Many believed that students who were unable to secure a place in other departments and poor in academic always ended up in the department of MOS. But it was not the same situation with me and several others. So, we really wanted to change that image. To a certain extent,



I believe that my batch mates were able to break that stereotyping as we received a lot of positive feedback about our potential and dedication from the lecturers in our department as well as in other departments.

My advice for the current students in the department is to engage in all the activities that are available and unleash your potential, as at the end of the day what matters is the right blend of academics with co-curricular and extra-curricular exposure. So, sharpen your skills which are more important when you become an employee or an entrepreneur one day. To do so, you need to commit full time in these four years. As a student, I never wanted to follow my degree part time while working. If I did so, I wouldn't have had the opportunity to engage in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities that sharpened my skills to be who I am today. Also, you need time to read articles and books to enrich your knowledge. Discussing with your fellow batch mates will also be helpful in realizing complex and advanced concepts. So, commit full time to your degree and enjoy the four years. Because you will be working all day once you pass out from the faculty.





Special Features of the Degree Offered by the Department of Management & Organization Studies

Our degree programme has been created to give students the knowledge, expertise and training they need in a variety of management and organizational topics. It aims to enable training they need in a variety of management and organizational topics. It aims to enable students to analyze current issues in management and organizational activities while giving an adequate theoretical understanding of the field of management and organization studies. Department of management and organization studies has obtained several exemptions from Institute of Charted Accountants of Sri Lanka (CA Sri Lanka), Chartered Institute of Personnel Management (CIPM), Charted Institute of Management Accountants Sri Lanka (CIMA) and Institute of Certified Management Accountants of Sri Lanka (CMA). And also we are still in the progress of getting exemptions for Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA) and The Chartered Institute of Marketing (CIM) by 2023, undergraduates of management and organization studies are provided with an industrial training hub which was initiated with the intention of assuring 100% students secure internship opportunities. Also this initiative helps undergraduates of Department of Management and Organization Studies to Find better internship opportunities in a reputed organizations.

Objectives of BIC

Competition Structure

Undergraduates of the Faculty of Management & Finance at the University of Colombo are eligible to participate in this competition. Participants can compete either individually or in teams and submit various ideas in English, Sinhalese, or Tamil. For this year's event, we received 24 ideas, and 10 were selected for the semi-final round. The top 10 business ideas were chosen by a panel of judges representing both academics and professionals from the industry.

The top six concepts has been selected after the initial evaluation further refined by taking into account the remarks of the evaluators. The improved top six concepts were then presented in the Grand Finale in front of a panel comprising academics and industry experts. The top three business ideas were selected, the winners were announced, and prizes were awarded at the conclusion of the event.
